The successful applicant will work under the mentorship of three board-certified specialists in ECC within our brand new, purpose-built Intensive Care Unit (ICU) and Emergency Room in our state-of-the-art private referral hospital at Dick White Referrals. Clinical duties will include receiving emergency referrals and managing critically ill patients hospitalised in our ICU.
